The main objective of the Careers Services has always been to promote the connection between companies and students, boosting quality employability, as well as highlighting to organisations the excellent education that the School offers, making our students attractive and valuable resources for the labour market.

In this context, the ISEG Careers Forum is back on the 6th and 7th November, once again with the participation of 70 Portuguese and multinational companies from various sectors of activity, ranging from finance to retail, technology, FMCG, industry, mobility, energy, services, and the public sector.

In the 2023 edition, around 1,500 students from all ISEG Study Cycles had the opportunity to submit 7,300 CVs to those employers present. Our expectation is that these numbers will be maintained or surpassed in this year's edition. For many of our students, this is the main gateway into the labour market.



In addition to the presence of the 70 companies, this year we are also offering students 9 workshops, a Business Breakfast with students and representatives from twelve partner companies and a Talent Bootcamp in partnership with Magma Studio, which is an event designed to get students thinking about the direction for which they want to take their careers and the development of their personal and employability skills. In this dynamic, company representatives, distributed in panels, will listen to the students' pitch and share personalised feedback, which will be really useful for their academic and professional future.

We believe this is a valuable opportunity for students to explore and broaden their knowledge of the labour market, identify companies that may be aligned with their professional goals, increase their networks and identify available job or internship opportunities. For companies, it's this Forum is an excellent opportunity to meet and identify high-potential students who fit their needs, as well as to activate their brands.

However, our commitment to promoting quality employability does not end with this, our biggest careers event. We constantly organise other initiatives throughout the year. For example, in the 2023/24 Academic Year, we organised and promoted 86 events, involving **120 companies**.

On the 7th November, , ISEG is hosting a conference on *Sovereign State Functions: transparency and the fight against corruption*, at 13.30, in the CGD Auditorium (Quelhas, 2nd Floor).

The event will start with a welcome session for participants and an opening aaddress by **João Duque**, Dean of ISEG, followed by the first panel, which will discuss the impact of corruption and the importance of transparency in the rule of law, based on the reflections of **Joana Marques Vidal**.

This panel will count with the presence of experts such as **Alessandra Silveira** (Associate Professor at the Law School of Universidade do Minho and a Director of CEDU), **João Duque** (Full Professor of Finance and Dean of ISEG), **Orlando Mascarenhas** (Director of the Instituto de Polícia Judiciária e Ciências Criminais - IPJCC and Specialist in Financial Investigations), **Paulo Sande** (Visiting Professor at the Institute of Political Studies, Universidade Católica Portuguesa), and **Vasco Guimarães** (PhD in Financial and Tax Law), and will be moderated by the journalist **Rita Marrafa de Carvalho**.

After a coffee-break, the second panel will give voice to political representatives, focusing on future policies and the responsibility of leaders in building a transparent state.
